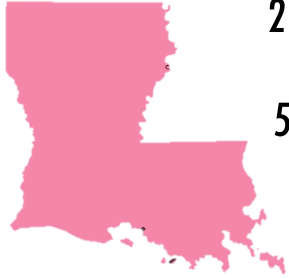




Louisiana Breast & Cervical Cancer Rankings
